



How to Instructions For Leather Bee Cuff Bracelet



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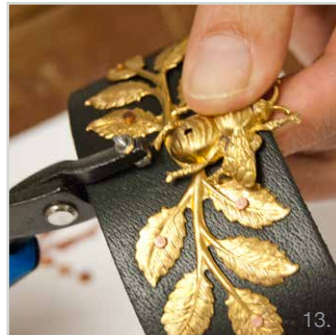
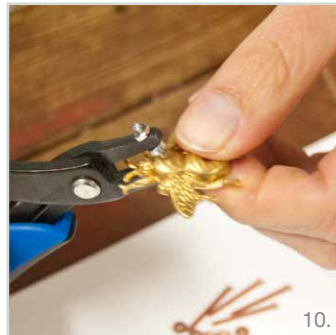
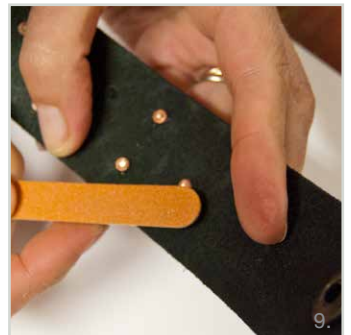
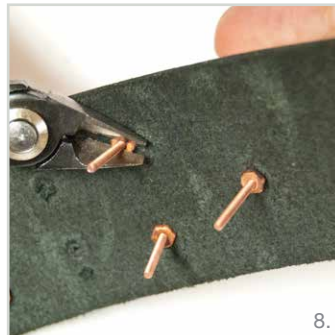
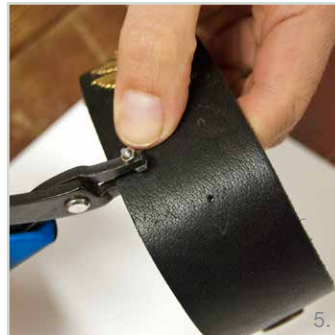
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NUNN DESIGN SUPPLIES:

- 1 Cuff Bracelet Leather 1-1/2" (cbl1.25-b)
- 2 Metal Embellishment Birch Leaves (mebl-bb)
- 1 Metal Embellishment Grande Bumblebee (megbb-b)
- 8 Micro Screw & Nut Set (msns-cb)
- G-S Hypo Cement (gs-hypo)

TOOLS NEEDED:

- Hole Punch Pliers 1.8mm (plhp18)
- Bending Pliers (pl574)
- Flush Cutters Pliers (plfc)
- File or Emery Board (yep as in doing your nails)



STEP 1: (Image 1)

Using Nylon Bending Pliers, curve two Birch Leaves.

STEP 2: (Images 2 & 3)

Using a pair of Hole Punch Pliers, punch three holes into the Brass Birch Leaves. Punch holes in three of the Birch Leaves using Hole Punch Pliers.

STEP 3: (Images 4 & 5)

Place the punched Birch Leaves onto the cuff. Using the Hole Punch Pliers, lightly indent the leather to indicate where to punch the three holes. Use the Hole Punch Pliers to punch through the indented leather cuff.

STEP 4: (Images 6 & 7)

Lay the Birch Leaves over the punched holes and insert Micro Screws. Thread nuts onto the screws. Place a dab of glue at base of leather prior to tightening the nut.

STEP 5: (Image 8)

Using a pair of Flush Cutters, trim the excess shank of the screw. Make sure to hold the shank in your fingers when cutting. I almost put my photographer's eye out with this cutting job! Sorry Melissa!

STEP 6: (Image 9)

Using a file, or in my case, an emery board from my purse, file down the cut end of the screw until smooth.

STEP 7: (no image)

Repeat steps 3-6 to attach the other Brass Birch Leaves Embellishment onto the other side.

STEP 8: (Images 10 & 11)

Using the Hole Punch Pliers, punch two holes into the Brass Grande Bumblebee Embellishment. It may indent the bee a wee bit, and in all honesty, I had my husband drill me a couple holes on mine. You may need to trim away any spurs on the underside of the bee with your Flush Cutters, making it easier for your screw to pass through the hole.

STEP 9: (Images 12 & 13)

Hold punched Bumblebee in position. Create an indentation mark in the leather cuff with the micro screw. Punch the two holes into the leather with Hole Punch Pliers.

STEP 10: (Image 14)

Thread your remaining 2 Micro Screw through the Brass Grande Bumblebee Embellishment and through the leather. Repeat Steps 4-6.

And there you have it! Awesome huh? I love it!
