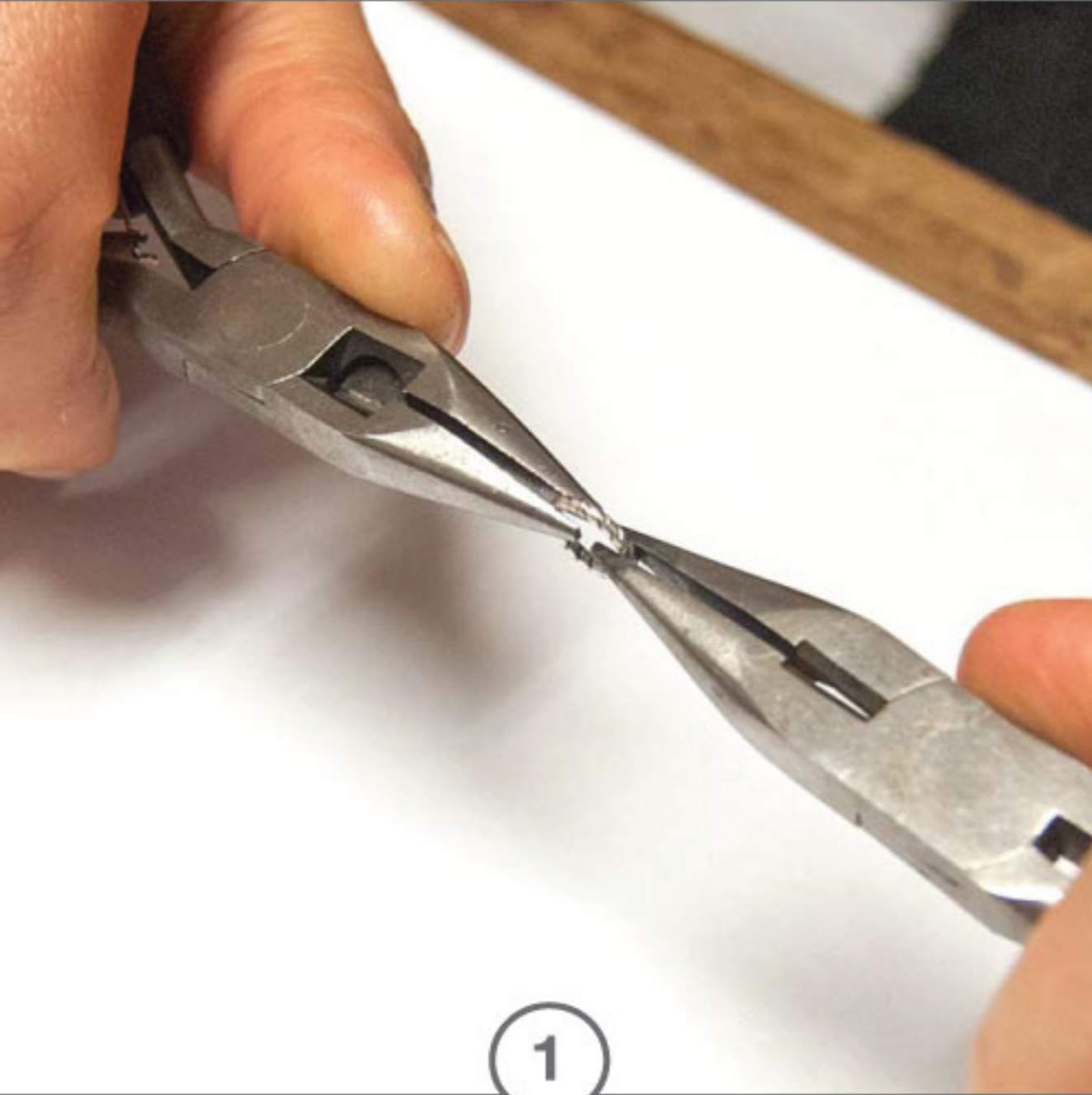


USE CRYSTAL CLAY ON CRYSTAL POINTS TO CREATE UNIQUE PENDANTS



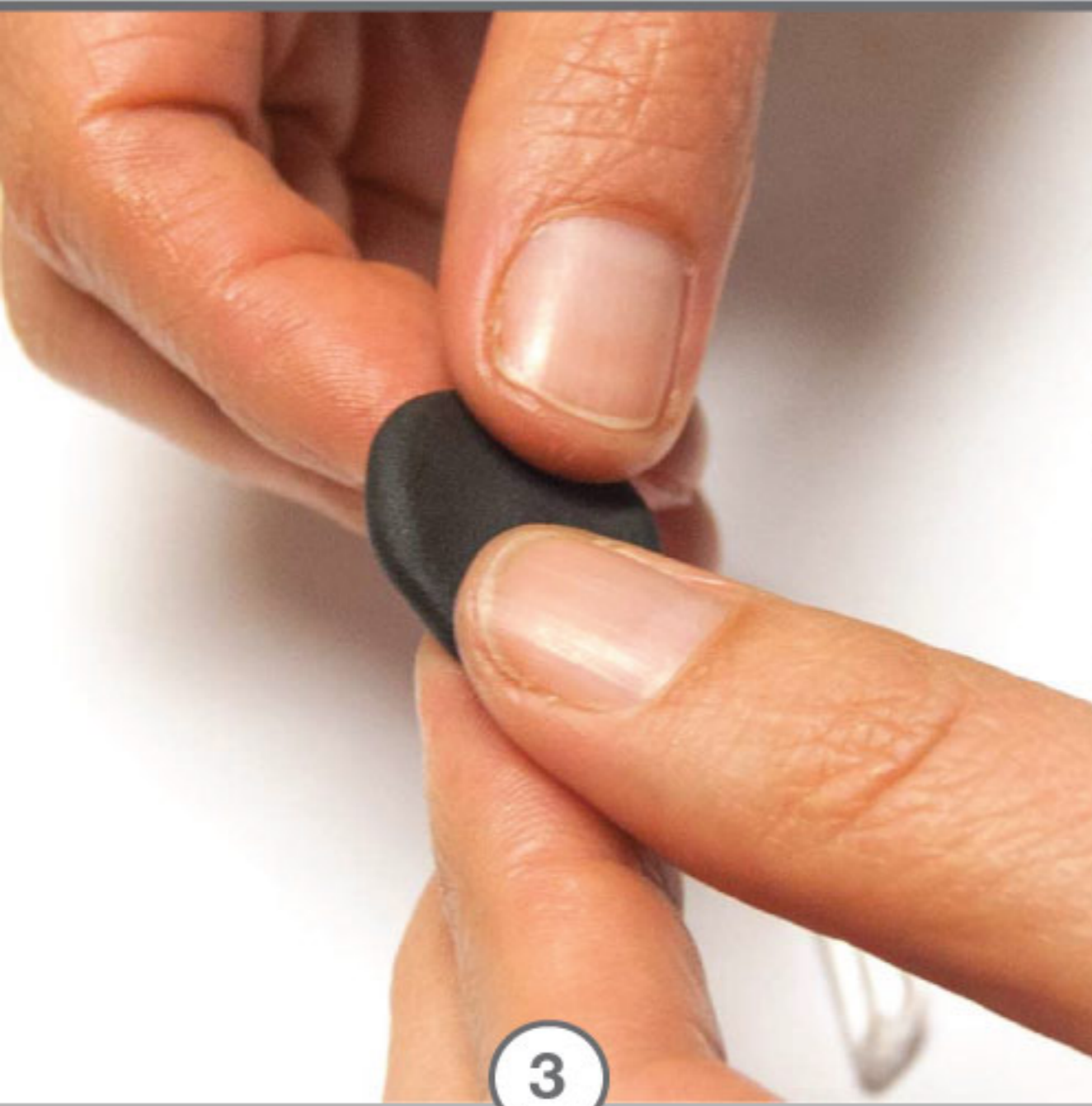

While hands are clean, before handling Crystal Clay, use needle nose pliers to make sure jumping is flush.



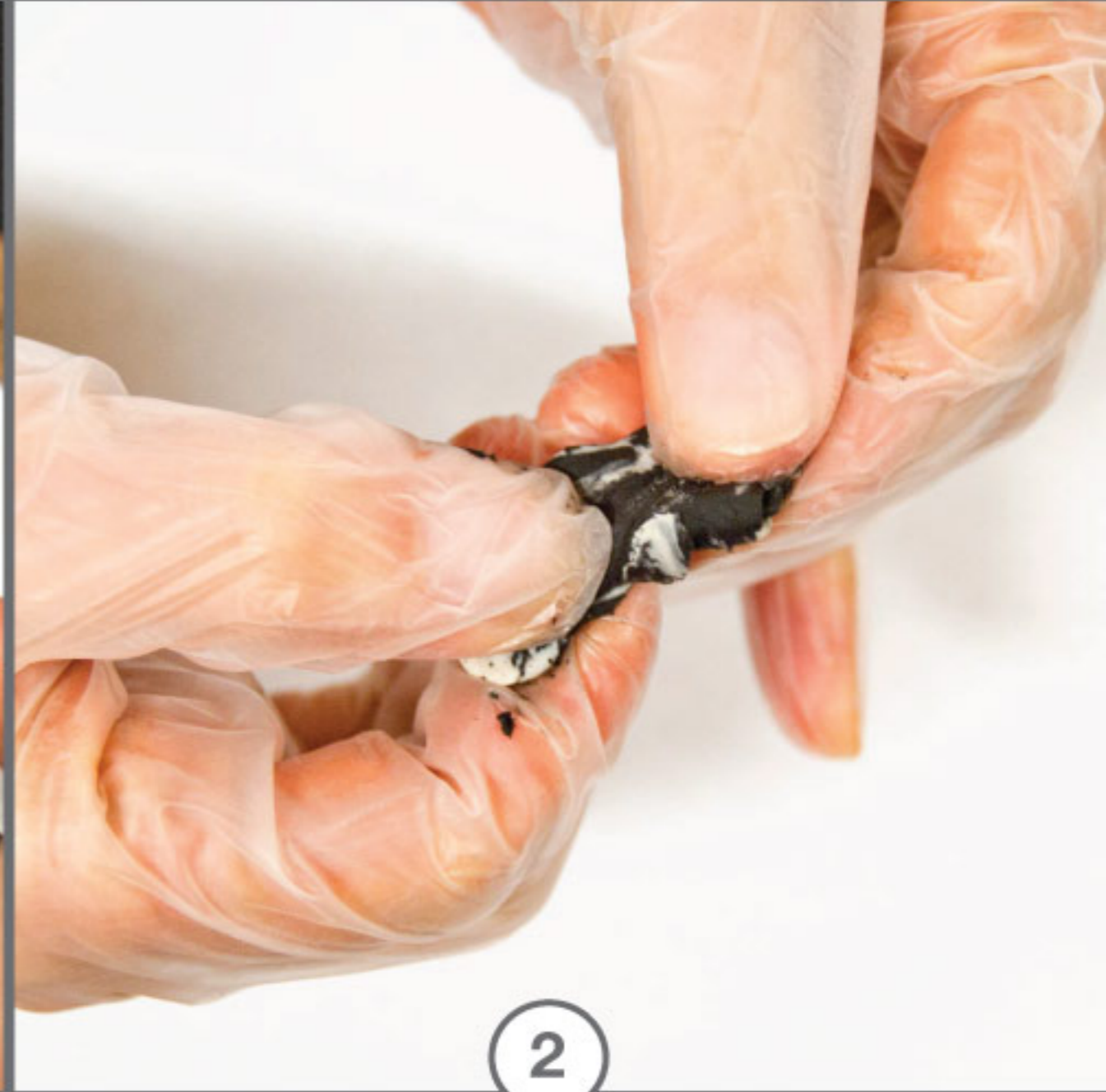

Mix up Crystal Clay: Pinch off marble sized balls of Part A and Part B and blend together fully until the clay is no longer marbled



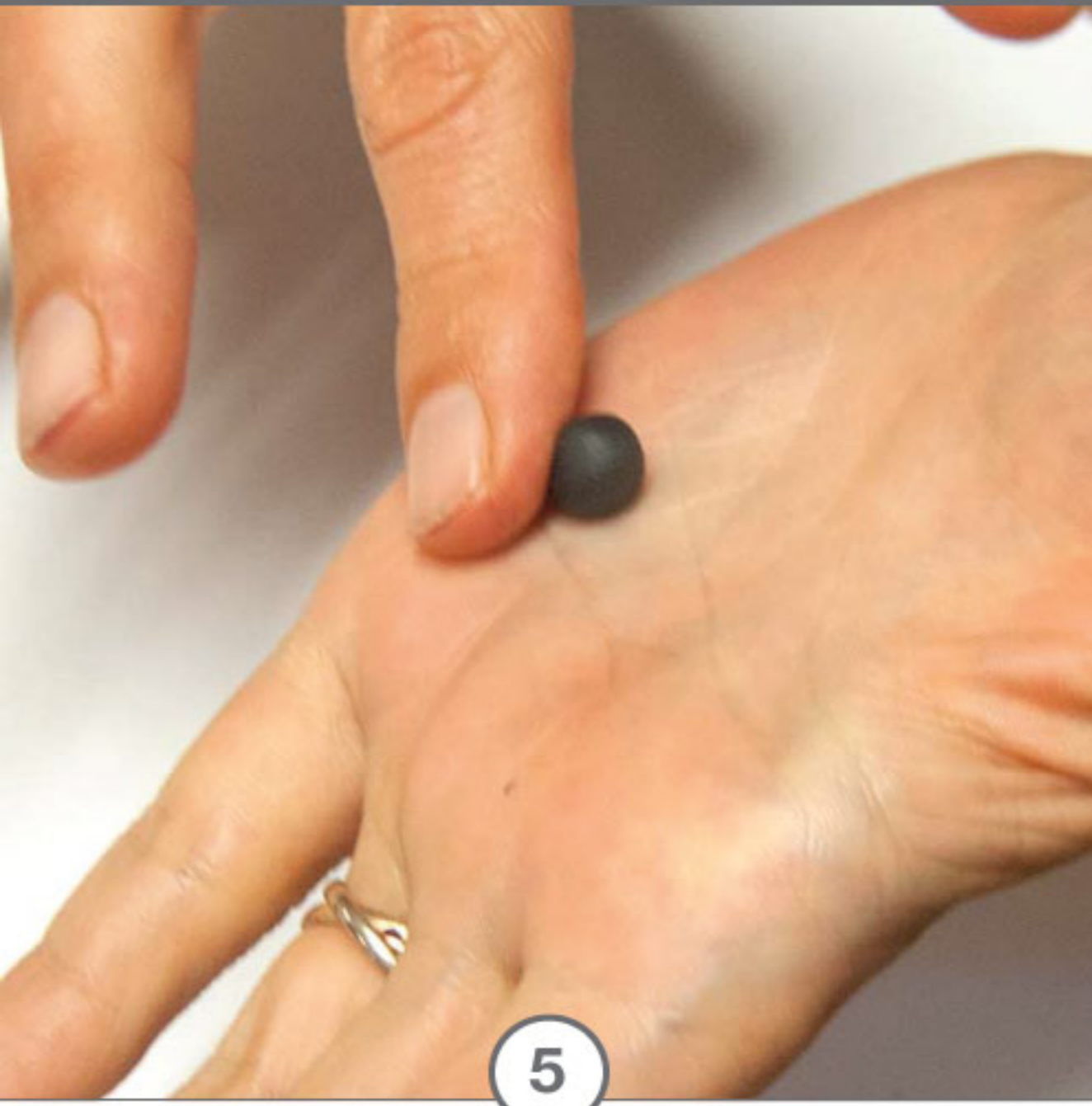

Pinch off pea size mixed ball of Crystal Clay and set-aside. Roll remaining ball in palms of hands until smooth. And then into a flat patty.



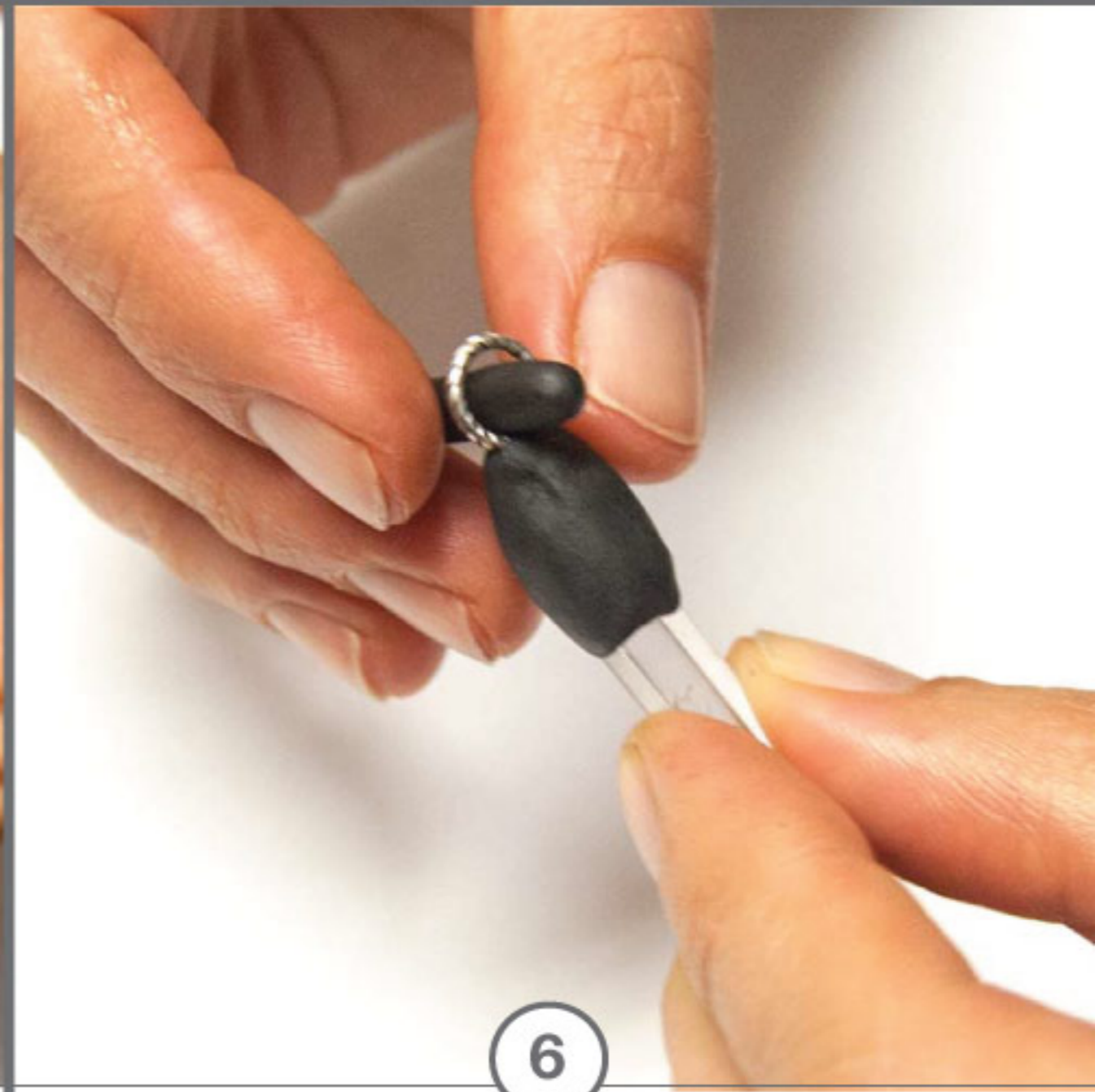

Place patty in center of end of crystal point. Wrap around the point with your fingers until fully attached and with a look that you like.

Roll pea size ball, saved from step 3, in palm of hand until smooth. Then create a snake shape by rolling in palm of both hands.

Thread snake of Crystal Clay through jumping. Attach both ends of snake onto wrapped Crystal Point, smooth into rest of clay.

Use a Q-Tip to apply PearlEx Mica Powders to a Clay Squisher. PearlEx Mica Powder will create visual interest and highlights.

Holding your Crystal Point, gently roll across the Clay Squisher. (If not happy, clean powder off with wet-wipe, reform clay and do over.)

To get an even better impression, you can pick-up the Clay Squisher and wrap it around the clay covered crystal. Let cure 24 hours.

Here are examples of using brown clay, metallic powders or rhinestone chain for some extra bling. Viola!
